Are you interested in the real life of Kenyans?

Would you like to experience daily life in a typical housing scheme, the type that you may have noticed while passing by on the main roads?

Do you want to talk to some of the local inhabitants in their homes?

In that case: Welcome to Kaloleni.

We will show you around one of the oldest settlements in Nairobi, invite you to talk to locals in their houses, let you take part in our social activities and try to answer your questions.

We will also walk with you through the nearby Burma Market and show you the scrap metal work market, the 'Jua Kali'.

We are a group of inhabitants of Kaloleni and a German university teacher who want to create a dialogue between tourists and the people of Kenya. We have planned and organised a lively programme for you to understand more about urban and rural life in Kenya. For children, we offer entertainment with children from Kaloleni.

Kaloleni is part of the Makadara division, located off Jogoo Road, 15 minutes drive from Nairobi city centre. You will be taken by minibus from your hotel to Kaloleni and back. We can organise half-day or full-day tours.

If you would like to compare life in Kaloleni with life in the slums of Nairobi, we will take you to Kibera and / or Mathare. We will accompany you together with local guides, visit their markets, sit and discuss with locals and witness some of their social activities.

We also offer a five-days visit to western Kenya. We will take you to Kisumu, Chemelil in the sugar belt, and Siaya near Lake Victoria, where we will spend the time with local farmers at their homes and in their fields.
